Ten years ago a group of intrepid Rosedale Middle School students and teachers, bike and outdoor enthusiasts, and community partners came together to build a trail system. Mapping a route from the Rosedale Arch to Fisher Park, using our natural topology and old trails made by deer, they eventually built 3.5 miles of nature trails in the heart of Rosedale.

Other improvements, like an orchard and a new playground for Fisher Park, grew from the trails as Rosedalians began to hike and bike for exercise and fun. In 2023, a new intrepid group began work on the next stage of the trail project. We are so excited to see the trails grow and improve, and we thoroughly enjoyed spending a (lot of the) year outside!

Rozarks Rising

Two AmeriCorps NCCC teams spent time in Rosedale this year on a mission to clear invasive honeysuckle from the Rozarks. If you've removed honeysuckle from your yard, you know that it's physically challenging, and it grows FAST. These groups cleared four full acres of honeysuckle from the Rozarks trails. Removing invasive species like honeysuckle is the first step toward restoring a healthy woodland ecosystem.

These teams and other volunteers also installed 81 new directional trail signs and two new trailhead signs, reopened a quarter mile of closed trail near the BPU substation, removed litter, and began cataloging the other native and invasive species in the Rozarks. We can't wait to see this woodland getting healthier!

Kicking It Up a Notch

Soccer continued to be one of the most popular activities in Rosedale last year, with 80 youth participating. Rosedale Youth Soccer is made possible by volunteer coaches and parents who show up twice a week to teach skills, run drills, and help instill a love of active outside play in Rosedale youth.

In Rosedale, youth soccer is about learning, staying active, and having fun with your friends and neighbors — not competition. That leaves time and space for youth to take on extra projects, like writing a letter to the Parks and Recreation Department requesting more lighting at Rosedale Park. It also allows parents and neighbors who aren't ready to coach in a competitive league hone their skills in a relaxed environment. Everybody wins when more of us play outside!

On the Move

Two big projects (and one small one) planning for the future of transportation in Rosedale took place in 2023.

The East-West Transit Study looked at how to create rapid transit through a new streetcar line or Bus Rapid Transit, from the KU Medical Center area to the east side of Kansas City, MO. The Rainbow Boulevard Planning Sustainable Places study built on the work of the Rosedale Master Plan to figure out future improvements and traffic flow on Rainbow Blvd. for a safer and more connected community.



Turkey Creek Trailhead preliminary design plan was created by Rosedale neighbors and an outside consultant. While the area is currently closed to the public, the Rosedale Master Plan calls for the trails to eventually be opened and connected to the Rozarks trails for a broad connected trail system across Rosedale. RDA is continuing to work with local government to implement the plan.






Staying Connected


Rosedale Leadership Council (RLC)
